### COURSE DESCRIPTION

Eighty hours of classroom instruction combined with 60 hours of clinical experience prepares students for entry level positions as phlebotomists and to be certified as **Registered Phlebotomy Technicians**. Classroom instruction includes 40 hours of lecture and 40 hours of skill practice in the lab. Clinical instruction is 60 hours.

## **CERTIFICATION**

Successful completion of this course with 50 venipunctures qualifies students to sit for phlebotomy certification through **American Medical Technologists**. Eligibility for this exam requires that students have a high school diploma or GED certificate. A criminal background check is also part of this application process. Fees for this certification exam are included in the course fees. Students must be 18 years of age to sit for this exam. **Taking this exam is a requirement of this course.**

## **CLINICAL PORTION OF THE COURSE**

Students will complete 60 hours of unpaid clinical training. Sites include Fairfield Medical Center, O'Bleness Memorial Hospital, Doctor's Hospital, Camden Clark Memorial Hospital, Marietta Memorial Hospital, Adena Regional Medical Center and clinics, Pleasant Valley Hospital, and Holzer Medical Center Clinics. Students must provide their own transportation to the clinical sites and must plan to be at their sites from 6:30 am – 3:30 pm weekdays. Twenty to thirty hours/week will be required. Starting dates and times will vary.

## **REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS: Students are registered first come-first serve.**

- Register at Hocking College by contacting Tanya Howe (215 Davidson Hall / 740-753-6350).
- Students earn 8 quarter credits for completion of this course.

First day of class you must:

- Submit proof of high school graduation: transcript, diploma or GED
- Submit documentation of a negative TB skin test (See County Health Departments or physician)
- Submit proof of current certification in CPR (Adult, Child, Infant, choking, and AED)

**TO ENTER THE CLINICAL PORTION OF THE TRAINING** students must also do the following:

1. Documentation of Hepatitis B vaccination or documented waiver.
2. Students must have a passing grade (75%) in quizzes and tests.
3. Students must attend 90% of their classroom hours.
4. Students must demonstrate professionalism and integrity in the classroom and lab.

**COSTS: See Hocking College.** Course costs approximately \$1500.00. Students may be eligible for Financial Aide through Hocking College's Financial Aide Department.

**PLEASE NOTE:** Student must be 18 years of age by the end of the course in order to sit for the certification exam..

Employment as a phlebotomist usually requires a criminal background check. A felony conviction **may** affect your ability to sit for the certification exam and/or to gain employment in this field. Since taking the certification examination is a requirement of this course, if for any reason you do not take the exam, you will not be considered a completer.
